We will cross the **Mighty Mac Bridge**, currently the fifth longest suspension bridge in the world, to the **Upper Peninsula** for our three-night stay in **Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan** at the Ramada Plaza Ojibway Hotel downtown across from the **Soo Locks**. It opened in 1927 and is the Oldest Hotel in Michigan's Oldest City. It has hosted George H W Bush and Barbara along with King, Queens, Celebrities, and sports stars. You

can watch the large barges come through the locks. Dinner is on your own in one of the restaurants in downtown Sault Ste Marie. Day 2: Enjoy a great Buffet Breakfast at Franks Place. Ride with the Freighters on the Soo Locks Boats Ride through the Soo Locks in Michigan's oldest city, Sault Ste. Marie. We'll visit the Upper and Lower Tahquamenon Falls for the beauty of nature. The chocolate-colored water and the beautiful fall leaves are to be remembered. Lunch at Camp 33. Whitefish Point, MI is the home of the Shipwreck Museum where evidence of the unrelenting fury of Lake Superior. Lake Superior has earned the reputation of being the most treacherous of the Great Lakes. Artifacts and exhibits tell the stories of sailors and ships who braved the waters of Superior and those who were lost to its menacing waves. The Edmonds Fitzgerald being the most famous. Dinner will be at the Sault Ste Marie Country Club. Day 3: Franks Place for Breakfast Early. All aboard! The Agawa Canyon Train for a Rail Adventure into the Heart of the Canadian Wilderness and one of the most popular train tours in North America. This wilderness excursion will transport you 114 miles north of Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, over towering trestles, alongside pristing northern lakes and rivers and through the awesome granite rock formations and vast mixed forests of the Canadian Shield. Through the large windows of our coach, the beauty of the region will unfold, and you will experience the same rugged landscapes that inspired the Group of Seven to create some of Canada's most notable landscape art. As the train winds its way through this immense land, a GPS triggered commentary will tell you about upcoming points of interest and share some of the rich history of the region with stories of the Ojibway, fur traders, explorers and entrepreneurs that pioneered this vast wilderness and called it home. Locomotive mounted digital cameras will provide an 'engineer's eye view' on the flat screen monitors installed throughout the coaches. Just when you thought you had seen it all. You will travel 500 feet down to the floor of the Agawa Canyon where you will have 90 minutes to experience the pristine beauty up close. Enjoy scenic walks on graveled trails, cascading waterfalls, and a quiet boxed picnic lunch beside the Agawa River. After our return to the States. Enjoy dinner on your own downtown Sault Ste Marie and the last chance to watch the ship come into the locks. Day 4: Franks Place one last time for a great breakfast. We begin our journey home with a stop at the Cross in the Woods. What an amazing seventon site. Join Us for a tremendous journey to see the color of the Agawa Canyon.
