





Located in the peninsula on the East side of Wisconsin, The beautiful area of Door County. We travel to Green Bay today. A stop at the National Railroad Museum. The Museum acquired unique locomotives such as Union Pacific #4017 "Big Boy," the Pershing and Dwight D. Eisenhower locomotives.



The Museum has more than 70 pieces of rolling stock & 100,000-plus small artifacts. An overnight stay at the Oneida Hotel. Day 2: A visit to the Oneida Nation and the Oneida Long House - a replica of a traditional





team's story. The Hall of Fame also displays trophies from the Packers' 13 world championships, including four Lombardi trophies. The hall's most popular exhibit is a replica of Vince Lombardi's office. The exciting and historical



we pick up our guide and drive past the Old Rugged Cross, a memorial to the writing of the famous hymn at the Sturgeon Bay church. You'll visit the Surgeon Bay Shipping Canal. It is 7 miles long, 125 feet wide, and 16 to 21 feet deep. Dinner at Door County SandBox. DAY 3: Board the Ferry to Washington Island, at the tip of Door County. It is 35 square miles and year-round home to 700 people and a destination for thousands of visitors annually. A stop at the Harbor/School House Beach is one of only five similar sand-less beaches worldwide. The small rocks were glacierpolished over thousands of years and are each small geological treasure.

Don't take one - It's against the law. The Stavkirke Church was built in 1995 and modeled after the Borgund Stave Church in Borgund, Laerdal, Norway, which was built in 1150. The building has

twelve 18-foot masts all harvested locally from the island and 9,600 four-inch-wide shingles making up the six-tiered roof of the Stavkirke. Lunch at Nelson's a local favorite. Enjoy Mann's Mercantile for a little shopping



for souvenirs. Back on the Mainland, a visit to the Death's Door Maritime Museum. It traces the area's commercial fishing tradition. Take in the shipwreck exhibit and the 1930 45-foot wooden fishing tug Hope. Porte des Mortes (Death's Door) is the strait of water that passes between Washington Island to the north and the Door Peninsula. Dinner is the famous Door County Fish Boil at the Old Post Office. A traditional Scandinavian feast made with locally caught Michigan whitefish, prepared outside over a roaring, open fire with small potatoes and

onions. Enjoy the history of the fish boil and watch the preparations too. **DAY 4:** This morning, we tour the **Eagle Bluff Lighthouse**, perched on a bluff 76 feet above Green Bay's glistening waters, its Lighthouse lamp brought solace to many a sailor. You'll have Free time in the heart of the northern Door County peninsula of Fish Creek, a town that embraces a heritage that began with humble farmers, lumberjacks & fisherman. Lunch

(Swedish pancakes and meatballs) at Al Johnsons, an authentic



Swedish Family-owned restaurant where, if we are lucky, find goats grazing on the sod roof. It's quite a sight! A visit to the **Bjorkunden Chapel**, a small wooden chapel built in a late 12thcentury Norwegian stave church style. A stop at the Koepsel Farm Market for last minute purchases for home. Our Farwell dinner will be at The Lure in Sister Bay. DAY 5: We journey home today. A stop at O&H Bakery, for Kringles! Stock Up, The freeze great! Wow what Fun!
