
COAST, LAKES, & THE COG

Maine and New Hampshire

stall at a local farmers market in 1991, before checking into our hotel in Ogunquit ME. This evening we'll enjoy dinner at a local restaurant nearby. Day 3: We visit Kennebunkport, and drive by Walkers Point, home of former President George Bush, overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. Scarborough we'll visit Lenny Libby's Candy Shop, home of the largest

chocolate moose in the world. Enjoy a tour of Portland, described by the poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow as "the beautiful town by the sea". The old Port Exchange on the thriving waterfront was the heart of the city's busy 19th century commercial ventures and continues to this day. Lunch will be on your own here. We'll return to Ogunquit for free time for shopping in Perkin's Cove, and then enjoy a traditional

Lobster Bake with entertainment at Foster's in Kittery ME. Day 4: We drive north to Freeport and visit the famous outlet store LL Bean and the other boutiques. We'll continue along the coast to picturesque Boothbay Harbor where we'll be captivated by the quiet coves, rocky shores,

and island lighthouses and by the warmth and friendliness of the locals. We'll have Lunch on our own and browse the many shops and boutiques and then enjoy a Harbor Cruise to Seal Rocks. Experience the thrill of seal watching in Maine on a delightful Boothbay Harbor Cruise. Explore summer colonies, lighthouses, and small islands as we

venture out to witness seals on the ledges and pass lighthouses and sea birds as well. We'll continue to Sunday River where we'll stay the night. On the way a stop in Manchester,

Headquarters of the Maine Cabin Masters of the hit TV show. The retail store is stocked with New England art, crafts, tools, and Maine Cabin Masters "merch", all hand-picked by the Cabin Masters themselves. Once again Dinner at a local establishment. Day 5: We travel to Bethel and visit the Maine Gem and Mineral Museum - one of the world's foremost

collections of extraterrestrial rocks—meteorites from Mars, the Moon and the Asteroid Belt that teach us about the origins of our Solar System.

After our visit, we'll travel into New Hampshire to the Mt Washington Cog Railway Base Station. We'll pick up a box lunch and then take the train to the summit of Mt. Washington. Clear conditions provide spectacular views of the Northern Presidential, the western face of the summit cone and the Mount Washington Observatory. Passengers will lay over at the summit for approximately one hour before returning to the base station. plenty of time to explore the Sherman

Adams Visitor Center and its rooftop observation deck, Extreme Mount Washington (an interactive weather exhibit), a cafeteria, and two gift shops. Send a card to friends and family with a unique Mount Washington post mark from the summit Post Office! Adjacent to the visitor center is the historic Tip Top House, an original summit hotel dating

back to 1853. It's the same building that sheltered Sylvester Marsh and his pastor during a life-threatening storm in 1857, and it's where the seeds of the Cog Railway were planted in his mind. Now a museum, it is believed to be the oldest existing mountain top hostelry in the world. Lodging in Tilton with dinner at a local restaurant. Day 6: Today, on to Moultonborough to visit the Castle in the Clouds. This 20th century

mansion is set amid the Ossipee Mountains, with spectacular vistas of the mountains and the Lake. It features a 16-room Arts and Crafts mansion, stable and six-car garage, two gatehouses, a greenhouse, a golf course and tennis court, a man-made lake, a boathouse on Lake Winnipesaukee, and miles of carriage and bridle trails. We'll head to the Squam Lake Natural Science Center to experience the beauty of Big Squam Lake on a canopied pontoon boat ride and learn about the

natural forces that created these lakes, the wildlife that makes them so special, and the people who have enjoyed them for over 5,000 years. It was here that the movie "On Golden Pond" was filmed. A Boxed Lunch is included. Later, it's off to

Meredith, a charming town located on Lake Winnipesaukee where we'll board the Winnipesaukee

Scenic Railroad Train. The ride is downhill most of the way to Weirs Beach. We pass through areas of unobstructed views of the lake with Mt Belknap in the background. In Native American Winnipesaukee means Smile of the Great Spirit. On the train we'll enjoy a famous Hart's Turkey Farm catered Home Style Dinner as Grandma served at Thanksgiving. Day 7: Travel to South Deerfield to stop at the Famous Yankee Candle Shop. A visit to Richmond in the Berkshires and visit the Furnace Brook Winery at Hilltop Orchards where we'll have a tour of the cidery and taste the cider and wine. We'll have lunch on our own enroute to Corning, NY where we'll spend the night. Day 8: Our last day on the road through Pennsylvania and Ohio. Reflecting on a lovely adventure around The Pine Tree state of Maine and White Birch Tree State of New Hampshire.
