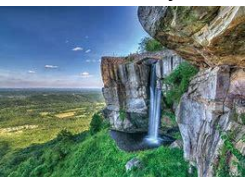

Day 1: Pardon me boys, but the beautiful Appalachian Mountains and the Tennessee River await. Stop in Bowling Green KY. at the **National Corvette Museum**. Explore the rich history and evolution of America's Sports Car. Witness a stunning collection of models, prototypes, and design studies that chronicle the Corvette's journey from concept to symbol of automotive excellence. Dinner at the **Sante Fe Cattle Co** before our overnight stay in Nashville TN. **Day 2:** Arrive at Chattanooga TN for a step-on guide City Tour. Visit to the **Chattanooga Choo Choo Hotel** and **Glen Miller Gardens** in a historic district in the heart of downtown. The old train terminal has been converted to a spectacular hotel. The Glen Miller Gardens sits on where the 14 tracks and 7 platforms served millions of train passengers for over 60 years. Named after the world-famous musician who recorded the Chattanooga Choo Choo song in 1941. Explore on your own with Lunch on your own. Visit **Rock City Gardens**, a true marvel of nature. It is a 4100 ft walking trail surrounded by massive rock formations, and gardens with over 400 native plant species, 90 ft waterfall, 180 ft suspension bridge. Check into the



Historic Read House Inn & Suites for a two-night stay. One of the most renowned hostelry's South of the Mason Dixon Line. Dinner at **Sticky Fingers Rib House**. Napkins are needed. **Day 3:** It's a Choo Choo Day. **Missionary Ridge Train Ride** travels along one of the original railroad lines into Chattanooga, crossing bridges, and passing through the historic Missionary Ridge Tunnel before arriving at East Chattanooga. Here, passengers can watch the locomotive being rotated on a turntable and tour the railroad restoration shop. The wheel shop is unique, housing a 90" diameter wheel lathe, a journal lathe, and a quartering machine, all under one roof and is the only one of its kind in North America. A visit to **Ruby Falls**



in Lookout Mountain to see the tallest underground cave waterfall in the United States. Descend 260 feet by glass-front elevator and walk the cavern trails to the thundering waterfall. It was accidentally discovered by Leo Lambert in 1928, and he named it after his wife. Rising 2,000 feet above sea level and overlooking Chattanooga is **Lookout Mountain**. Round trip ride on the **Incline Railway** known as "America's Most Amazing Mile." The Incline's trolley-style cars descend through the natural beauty surrounding historic Lookout Mountain at a breathtaking 72.7% grade – straight down! Sit back, relax and enjoy the scenic views of the mountains and valleys from the observation windows on the train as well as the panoramic views from the observation tower at The Incline's top station. Our evening is spent on the **Tennessee Valley Dinner Train**. Celebrate the adventures of yesteryear on Chattanooga's iconic railroad, while traveling aboard a restored 1924 dining car and enjoying a three-course dining experience. **Day 4:** A memorable day at **Falcon Rest Mansion & Gardens** in McMinnville TN. The Victorian mansion was built in 1896 by Clay Faulkner, owner of the Woolen Mill that made gorilla pants. A tour of the home and gardens, then an unforgettable history lesson Lunch. We make our way back to Nashville. Dinner on your own at **Opry Mills** and a chance to walk through the **Opryland Hotel**. **Day 5:** Pardon me Boys why don't you Choo Choo me home.
