Let's continue Celebrating our Nation's Birthday. Travel day to Canton, OH for a light lunch at **Benders Tavern**. Visit our 25th President and his family at the **William McKinley Museum and Presidential Library**. Tour the Museum and visit the beautiful tomb. Enjoy an evening of dinner and a **Patriotic show**. Day 2: Visit **David Warther Carvings**. His work is a collection of intricately carved miniatures that depict **sailing ships** from ancient Egypt, circa 3000 B.C. to modern times. Over 90 ship carvings, are made of legal pre-ban ivory and ebony wood. You'll be intrigued by the ivory rigging. Each line is made of ivory that has been hand filed to seven thousandths of an inch (.007") in diameter and then masterfully applied to the ship carving. Lunch on your own and shopping in the quaint town of **Berlin**. A tasty stop at **Troyers Sweet Shoppe**. A third generation, family own business offering all kinds of chocolate nut clusters to truffles. Take home 6 Buckeyes. In the heart of Ohio's largest Amish settlement and listed



on the National Register of Historic Places is the **Victorian Mansion**. This 28 room Queen Anne style home was built in 1901 and is approximately 7,000 square feet. The house has appeared on "Victorian America", an HGTV production, and must recently used for a full feature Hollywood production "Love Finds You in Valentine".



At **The Sieverdes Millersburg Glass Museum**, where John Fenton started it all over 110 years ago, see some of the rarest and most expensive pieces ever produced, learn about the company's story, Dinner at the **Amish Door Inn** with a show by **Van Scott II's Salute to Old Glory**. This energetic one-man show will take you back in time to view the many flags our country had before our beloved Stars and Bars we have now. Day 3: A visit to **Fort Laurens** – the only Revolutionary Fort in Ohio! It was built as a strategic location for staging an attack on the British at Fort Detroit during the American Revolution. Next stop **Schoenbrunn**



Village – Ohio's first settlement by Moravian Missionaries and known for its harmonious coexistence with the Delaware Indian tribe. Established in 1772 and only lasted until 1777. The village includes the original cemetery and 16 reconstructed log structures, as well as the church and gardens. A buffet lunch at the **Der Dutchman Restaurant** before our **Dave Banks Big Band USO Show America Remembers**. Enjoy 6 decades of live music with a **17-piece big band orchestra** showcasing the **USO style shows during wartime years**.
